Thank you for your requests made under the Official Information Act 1982, received on 9 December 2022. You requested the following:

Could I please request the following information about Working for Families:

- An update to the attached table (previously received from IRD) to cover the period 2015-2022 (or the most recent year available).
- An Excel table showing the most recent available figures for the number of people receiving Working for Families by electorate, or if this is not possible, by territorial authority.

Information being released

Working for Families tax credits include Family tax credit, Minimum Family tax credit, In Work tax credit, a tail¹ of historic Child tax credit claims, Parental tax credit to June 2018, and Best Start from July 2018.

Appendix One provides an update of the regional Working for Families information previously supplied. Information has been updated for the 2015 to 2021 income tax years. Information for the 2022 income tax year has not been provided as customers have until March 2023 to finish filing their income tax returns, which enable Working for Families entitlements to be calculated.

The information provided includes all:

- Working for Families customers with an annual entitlement calculated by Inland Revenue, including square ups of Work and Income customers, where the annual entitlement is non-zero; and
- Working for Families payments made by Work and Income to its customers where their customers have not been squared up by Inland Revenue. In this case the entitlement is assumed to be the sum of payments made.

The data in the updated table will differ from previously provided data which did not include the second group of Work and Income (only) customers.

The information provided does not include:

- Customers that received Working for Families payments by Inland Revenue who were not entitled to the payment once squared up at year end; nor
- Customers that received Working for Families payments from Inland Revenue that have not yet filed a return.

Customers have been mapped to a region based on their post code recorded in the system at the time their Working for Families return was filed or at the time of the Work and

Income payments. Where a post code straddles more than one region customers have been randomly allocated between the adjoining regions. Customers with no post code recorded have been included in the tables as 'unknown'.

Information for the 2015 to 2017 years has been created from sample data and as a result has been rounded to the nearest 10th digit. Full population data has been used to create information for the 2018 to 2021 years.

Appendix Two provides information on Working for Families recipients by territorial authority. Minor variations may occur between Appendices One and Two based on minor differences in the methodology to assign customers between regions and territorial authority e.g. the random approach to assigning customers where a post code straddles more than one region or territorial authority.
