Thank you for your request made under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), received on 28 May 2024. You requested the following:

Could you please provide data on the employment and taxation status of the Filipino population in New Zealand for the most recent period available? Specifically, we are interested in understanding their employment sectors, wage/salary distribution, median wage/salary + further details if possible, and any relevant information. Description and count per age, sex, region of these aspects would be appreciated.

Inland Revenue does not record ethnicity information. As such, your request is refused under section 18(g) of the OIA, the requested information is not held by Inland Revenue, nor do I have reason to believe this information is held by another department.

I have checked with Stats New Zealand to see if it holds the relevant data. Stats New Zealand mentioned that while they do not hold the information you seek at the level of detail requested, it does publish income data by ethnicity, which can be found at <u>NZ Stat (stats.govt.nz)</u>.

Further to this, Stats New Zealand provides information about making customised data requests (including the cost), which can be found at <u>Customised data services | Stats NZ.</u>

Finally, you may also be able to apply to use microdata held by Stats New Zealand if the information you seek is needed as part of a research project, more information can be found at <u>Apply to use microdata for research | Stats NZ.</u>

Right of review
